Major Assumptions:

- CA Scrap Tire Disposal Rate:
 1.1 tires per person per year, slightly higher than the national average.
- PTE (passenger tire equivalent) is 20 lbs., lower than RMA's estimation.
- Large truck tire is equal to 6 PTEs.
- One PTE = approximately 12 lbs. of crumb rubber.

2005 Crumb Rubber:

5.2 million PTEs

--2.0 million PTEs in RAC --3.2 million PTEs in rubber products

2005 "Other" Recycling:

3.2 million PTEs

--Includes roofing shingles, huaraches, agricultural uses

2005 Civil Engineering (TDA):

2.0 million PTEs

--2.0 million PTEs in landfill applications--0 in retaining wall, septic, landslide, vibration dampening projects

2005 Alternative Daily Cover (ADC):

4.7 million PTEs

2005 Retreading:

4.4 million PTEs

--Mostly large truck tires

2005 Tire-Derived Fuel (TDF):

9.1 million PTEs

--7.4 million PTEs in cement plants --1.7 million PTEs in cogeneration facilities

2005 Imported:

(1.5 million PTEs)

--Subtracted from other categories to arrive at California scrap tire diversion (from landfill) rate
